

BOARD MEMBER AUTHORITY

Members of the Board of Education have legal authority for the conduct of the district schools only when acting as a body in a properly convened session. Any such authority may be exercised only by a quorum of the full Board at an official public session. All such actions must be included in the minutes of the official public session. Board members have no authority other than that authorized by a majority of the full Board.
