Dear Valley Stream UFSD Thirteen Parents and Guardians,


Today, a staff member at Wheeler self-reported that they tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19). Following the guidance issued by the New York State Education Department, and the Nassau County Department of Health (NCDOH), we immediately contacted the county health department for confirmation and direction.

The staff member's last day of attendance was Friday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>. The staff member will not be allowed to return to school until Monday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>. The NCDOH is conducting an investigation and contacting anyone identified as a close contact to the staff member.

As a reminder, our facilities are cleaned and disinfected on a daily basis as per the New York State Department of Education and CDC guidelines. Based on guidance from the NCDOH, it is not necessary that we enact any further restrictions or measures at this time.

We will continue to monitor this case and keep you updated with any pertinent information. Please continue to exercise the safe practices recommended by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) including socially distancing, wearing a mask, and frequent hand washing.

Dear Valley Stream UFSD Thirteen Parents and Guardians,

Today, a family at the Howell Road Elementary School self-reported that a parent of a child in one of our classrooms tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19). Following the guidance issued by the New York State Education Department, and the Nassau County Department of Health (NCDOH), we immediately contacted the county health department for confirmation and direction. We also confirmed whether there are any siblings attending the Central High School District or other regional schools.

The student's last day of attendance was Monday, January 25<sup>th</sup> and is reportedly not presenting any symptoms associated with COVID-19. The student will not be allowed to return to school for at least 10 days. The NCDOH is conducting an investigation and contacting anyone identified as a close contact to the student's family member.

As a reminder, our facilities are cleaned and disinfected on a daily basis as per the New York State Department of Education and CDC guidelines. Based on guidance from the NCDOH, it is not necessary that we enact any further restrictions or measures at this time.
